Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee; blessed art thou among women; and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Hail, Holy Queen

Hail, holy Queen, mother of mercy, our life, our sweetness, and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve; to thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this valley of tears. Turn then, most gracious advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us; and, after this, our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus. O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary.

Pray for us O holy mother of God, that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

(Otherwise:) And may Almighty God bless us, the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Amen.



1. The Sign of the Cross
2. Opening Prayers
3. Pray a Glory Be
4. Pray the First Decade
 - A. Announce the first Mystery
 - B. Pray an Our Father on the large bead
 - C. Pray 10 Hail Marys, one on each small bead
 - D. Pray a Glory Be



5. Repeat Step 5 for the remaining 4 Mysteries
6. After 5 decades, pray a Hail Holy Queen and Closing Prayers
7. The Sign of the Cross

THE MYSTERIES OF THE HOLY ROSARY OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Traditionally certain mysteries are prayed on specific days of the week.

Monday *Joyful Mysteries* Friday *Sorrowful Mysteries*
 Tuesday *Sorrowful Mysteries* Saturday *Joyful Mysteries*
 Wednesday *Glorious Mysteries* Sunday *Glorious Mysteries*
 Thursday *Luminous Mysteries*

THE JOYFUL MYSTERIES

The First Joyful Mystery The Annunciation

He said, "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women." Luke 1:28

The Second Joyful Mystery The Visitation

When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leaped in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit Luke 1:41

The Third Joyful Mystery The Birth of Jesus

She gave birth to her first-born Son and wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger. Luke 2:7

The Fourth Joyful Mystery The Presentation

When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, they brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord. Luke 2:22

The Fifth Joyful Mystery The Finding of the Child Jesus in the Temple

After three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. Luke 2:46

The First Luminous Mystery The Baptism of Jesus

And a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." Matthew 3:17

The Second Luminous Mystery The Wedding at Cana

His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." John 2:6

The Third Luminous Mystery The Proclamation of the Kingdom

As you go, proclaim the good news, 'The kingdom of heaven has come near.' Matthew 10:7

The Fourth Luminous Mystery The Transfiguration

Then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!" Luke 9:35

The Fifth Luminous Mystery The Institution of the Eucharist

He broke it and gave it to them, saying, "This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." Luke 22:19-20

THE SORROWFUL MYSTERIES

The First Sorrowful Mystery The Agony in the Garden

In his anguish he prayed more earnestly, and his sweat became like great drops of blood falling down on the ground. Luke 22:44

The Second Sorrowful Mystery The Scouring at the Pillar

Then Pilate took Jesus and had him flogged. John 19:1

The Third Sorrowful Mystery The Crowning with Thorns

And they clothed him in a purple cloak; and after twisting some thorns into a crown, they put it on him. Mark 15:17

The Fourth Sorrowful Mystery The Carrying of the Cross

And carrying the cross by himself, he went out to what is called the Place of the Skull, which in Hebrew is called Golgotha. John 19:17

The Fifth Sorrowful Mystery The Crucifixion

Jesus uttered a loud cry and said, "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit." Luke 23:46

THE GLORIOUS MYSTERIES

The First Glorious Mystery The Resurrection

But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here." Mark 16:6

The Second Glorious Mystery The Ascension

So then the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven and sat down at the right hand of God. Mark 16:19

The Third Glorious Mystery The Descent of the Holy Spirit

All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. Acts 2:4

The Fourth Glorious Mystery The Assumption

When they met her, they all blessed her with one accord and said to her, "You are the glory of Jerusalem, you are the great boast of Israel, you are the great pride of our nation! Judith 15:9-10

The Fifth Glorious Mystery The Coronation

A great portent appeared in heaven: a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars. Revelation 12:1
